Pak attack in Keran subsection of Jammu and Kashmir

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI LALIT VIJAY SINGH): (a) and (b) Pakistan had resorted to unprovoked firing with mortar and heavy artillery in the Keran Sector on 4-10-1990, in which three of our personnel were wounded. Fire was effectively returned. Casualties suffered by the Pakistanis are not known.

-N (C) There have been occasions when the Pak troops were giving fire cover to the Pak trained militants returning to the Indian side of the Line of Control. Such firing had to be effectively returned by the Indian troops, to foil such attempts.

Economic package for Punjab
