- problem 'No Source' (b) 4166 villages are likely to be covered by 31-3-91 under the State Sector Mini-Programme, Centrally mum Needs Sponsored Accelerated Rural Water Supply Programme etc
- (c) Most of the remaining 3162 problem villages are likely to be covered in the second year of VIII Plan However, the actual time frame for coverage of hard core problem villages in Jammu & Kashmır, hilly areas in Uttar Pradesh, Pradesh, Hımachal depend upon the Punjab etc. will availability of financial resources in VIII Plan, infrastructure, normal time required for completion of schemes etc.
