Increase in the prices of edible oils

Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state.

(a) what had been the average prices of edible oils during the last three years; yearwise and oil wise;

- (b) whether any steps have been taken to bring down the price of edible oils; and
 - (c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI SARWAR HUSSAIN): (a) the average wholesale prices of edible oils at important centres during the last three oil years (Nov.—Oct.), yearwise and oilwise are as under:

- (b) and (c) Among other measures taken to check the prices are:
 - (i) Excise rebate allowed on usage of minor/non-traditional oils.
 - (ii) The stock limits of edible oils (including hydrogenated vegetable oils) with wholesalers and retailers have been reduced.
 - (iii) The stock limits of edible orls and vanaspati with the producers have been halved
 - (iv) The State Governments have been advised to undertake dehoarding operations on regular basis to enforce the reduced stock limits;
 - (v) To improve the availability and acceptability of edible oils, blending of one conventional edible oil with one refined non-coventional oil (e.g. soyabean, cotton-seed, safflower oils) has been permitted.

(vi) The permision to use upto 20 per cent expeller mustard/RS oil in the manufacture of vanaspati has been withdrawn, to ease the price pressure on mustard oil.
