kerosene to State Fovernments/UT Administration for distribution thro-Public Distribution System. Some State Governments have included additional items such as tea, salt, soap matches coarse grain etc for distribution through fair price shops

(c) Apart from the measures the broad macro-economic front such as efforts to reduce growth in money supply and fiscal discipline, specific measures have been taken by the Government in respect of particular essential commodities under pressure The measures taken by the Government broadly include steps to increase the production of essential commodities, effective procurement and buffer stocking operations of foodgrains, strengthening of Public Distribution System, monitoring of the prices and availability situation, strict enforcement of the provisions of the Essential Commodities Act and other regulatory measures, and augmenting domestic supplies through imports, subject to overall constraints of foreign exchange
