In 1987. a National Industrial Tribunal was consti-After two and a half years, that Tribunal presided over by the former Chief Justice of the Andhra Pradesh High Court, Justice Shri Obul Reddy, has given award on 30th of April this year. The Award was given after two and half years of deliberations. The Justice moved about all parts of the country to find out by personal experience really what problems are, whether really they are doing the job like commercial banks and whether their salaries should be on par with the commercial bank employees. Ultimately, he gave an award and said. yes, the Regional Rural Bank employees should be put on par with the commercial bank-employees as far as their wages and service conditions are concerned. four and a half months have passed since that Award was given. Normally, under the rules, under the laws, under the Act, within a limited time-frame the Award is to be published in the Gazette. But in this case it has not been done vet. The question comes that Government's decision was that the Award of the Tribunal will be considered as final and binding on all the sides, including, of course, the Government, then where is the hesitation for the Government to publish it in a Gazette and why is the Government not lifting even a little finger to get Awar**d** implemented? There 70,000 Grameen Bank employees, from senior officers down to the part-time swee-The Award has been given. the Government is not moving at

I should say, as much pressure as possible on the Government. The Deputy-Minister of Finance who is looking after the Banking is here. The question is that this Award has got to be gazetted. And immediate steps should be taken for implementation of the provisions of Award for the benefit of the Regional Rural Bank employees, the Grameen Bank employees as they are normally called. a Need to Convert Gopalnur Port in Orissa Port

SHRI BASANT KUMAR DAS (Orissa): Hon. Vice-Chairman, Sir, my Special Mention is regarding the development of Gopalpur port. This port, Sir, is situated in the Ganjam district, near the Paradeep This is a small fair weather port. It is estimated that one million tonnes of coal will be transported through this port. This has anchoring facilities and loading and unloading facilities. Only the shore facilities of anchoring are There is no jetty and nothing of the sort, and because of that, the entire infrastructure remains operative only for 5 months. For the rest of the 7 months, the entire infrastructure remains idle, and the clearance of the coal is not made possible, the targeted amount of coal is not transported. Therefore, Sir, the Government of India, in their inter-Ministerial meeting held by the Coal Secretary on the 16th of January, 1990, decided to send a team to study the secondary port outlet near Paradeep. And they have suggested that further development of this port is required, and the investment will be around Rs. 50 And if that is completed, then only projected traffic of about 42.61 million tonnes of coal can be cleared from Paradip port.

In this connection, I would like to point out that a company from here. Delhi. was engaged as consultants. The C.E.S. India Private Limited, New Delhi, were jointly engaged by the Asian Development Board and the Planning Commission as consultants to study the ports and the shipping sector in India.
