**SHRI SIKANDER BAKHT:** That part of the question does not arise. I concede the fact that the Government cannot interfere in sports management. What I am saying is that the sickness of sports management bodies is being transferred to the players themselves and the players are becoming sick and diseased. A diseased player can never perform. What are you going to do about it?

**SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA:** This is a very serious observation. We will inform the managements that this is the impression of the hon. Members and we would like to get their response.

#### Pesticides for use in forestry

\*363A. **SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD:** Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether a list of pesticides for use in forestry has been prepared on the U.K. Model and if so, the details thereof; and

(b) if not, the reasons therefor and corrective action to be taken in this regard?

**THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI NILAMANI ROUTHAY):** (a) and (b) A Statement is laid on the Table of the House.

#### Statement

(a) and (b) List of pesticides for use in forestry on the basis of U.K. Model has not been prepared by Government of India. However, a list of insecticides being commonly used to control insect pests and diseases in forest nurseries and plantations has been prepared by Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun. Details are given in the enclosed Annexure.

SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD: Sir, the hon. Minister has given a list of pesticides used in forests, nurseries and plantations. I am afraid that some of the pesticides are not safe to our ecology and environment. As I referred to in my question, in U.K. the pesticides used in forests is limited to safer chemicals. So, I want to know from the hon. Minister whether the Government would make pesticide poisoning a notifiable disease in the country in view of the large number of unreported cases as highlighted by the recent tragedy at Basti in U.P. and some parts of Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh.

SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY: Sir, we are utilising the pesticides. The list that has been chalked out by us is in consultation with the Forest Research Institute at Dehra Dun. They have prescribed a list. They have given a list. And we are following that. So far as the British model is concerned,

we have no such model. But we are following that also.

SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD: Sir, I just wanted to know whether he would make pesticide poisoning a notifiable disease in the country. He is not answering my question. I want your protection, Sir.

SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY: Sir, I will look into that matter, if it is possible.

SHRI B. K. HARIPRASAD: Sir, I want to know whether the Government will encourage the NGOs in taking up controlled field trials on organic or such sustainable farming without the use of chemicals in our country.

SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY: Sir, the manufacture and use of pesticides is regulated in this country under the Insecticide Act of 1968. The Schedule appended to this Act lists out 502 pesticides at present. Out of them, only

124 pesticides have been registered in the country for manufacture and use. So far as the hon. Member's question whether we can take any steps to stop the use of certain pesticides is concerned, that I will examine, if that is possible.

दूसरा प्रश्न जो इसी से जुड़ा है वह यह है कि क्या इनमें से कुछ को दूसरे देशों से आयात करना पड़ता है ? अगर करना पड़ता है तो वे कौन कौन से हैं ?

**SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY:** It is a compendium of pesticides... (In. terruptions)

**SHRI SURESH KALMADI:** That particular file is with Mrs. Maneka Gandhi.

**SHRI SUBRAMANIAN SWAMY:** Is that particular file with Mrs. Maneka Gandhi.

**SHRI SURESH KALMADI:** That is why the Minister of State is required for back up. (Interruptions)

**SHRI ATAL BIHARI VAJPAYEE:** He will require notice.

**SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY:** Sir, most of them are manufactured in the country. For details, I want notice.

**SHRI H. HANUMANTHAPPA:** Sir, the main thrust of the question is lost. Under the British model..
