(c) M/s. Dilip Roy & Co. has not been awarded any repair work by the IWAI. The IWAI have intimated that with regard to repair work identified to be done during 1989 they had floated tender enquiries to 33 firms, 16 firms including the Public Sector Undertakings, M/s. Rajabagan Dockyard, CIWTC, M/s. Hoogly Dock and Port Engineers Ltd., M/s. Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd. and M/s. Shalimar Works Ltd. had responded. The tender forms for the works were issued to 15 out of 16 firms, since one firm was under lock-out. However, only 3 offers were received on the due date of opening. M/s. Hoogly Dock & Port Engineers, Rajabagan Dockyard, CIWTC, Garden Reach Workshop, etc., did not send their offers by the due date. Based on the Tender Committee evaluation and recommendation, the works were awarded on the basis of lowest acceptable tender to two parties, namely (i) M/s. R. D. Enterprises, Calcutta for dry docking repairs of vessel, S.L. Survekshak and S.L. Ghogra and (ii) M/s. B. N. Bose & Co., Calcutta for Dry docking repairs of vessel ML Bahika.

Centralising the D.E.T. in Bardhaman District in West Bengal

3200. SHRI SUNIL BASU RAY: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government propose to centralise the D.E.T. in Bardhaman district in West Bengal;

(b) if so, whether Government are aware of the consequential inconveniences; and

(c) if so, whether Government would prefer to retain the present system?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI JANESHWAR MISHRA): (a) The D.E.T., Bardhaman will continue to function from Bardhaman. He will be responsible for all operational activities, including development, as at present. The Telecom. revenue and certain administrative functions, which form part of the Telecom. District Manager's Office would function from the TDM's office at Asansol.

(b) and (c) Only a section of the staff numbering about 30, would be affected. This movement, which should have been done few years back, has to be completed so that the Asansol Secondary Switching Area functions in the desired manner. This is in conformity with the All India Policy adopted by the department.
