

(b) the directions given to those power plants to take adequate measures in this regard; and

(c) the response of those power plants to the directions of the Central Government?

THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY): (a) There are two thermal power plants in Orissa, namely, the Talcher Thermal Power plant (TTPS) and National Aluminium Company (NALCO), with installed capacities of 440 MW and 600 MW, respectively. Both the Thermal Power Plants have installed Electrostatic Precipitators (ESPs) and have adequate wastewater treatment facilities. The ESPs need augmentation to meet the present emission standards.

(b) The Orissa State Pollution Control Board has directed both the thermal power plants to instal either desulphurisation units or raise the heights of the stacks. The Central Government have not issued any directions to these units.

(c) Does not arise.

Implementation of National Literacy Mission through Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan

11. SHRI SAMAR MUKHERJEE: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have requested the Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan to send proposals for continuance of National Literacy Mission through them;

(b) if so, what is the Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan response thereto;

(c) whether it is also a fact that the Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan could not continue with implementation of the Project due to mismanagement of funds by some of its Kendras; and

(d) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) to (d) Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan is one of several implementing agencies entrusted with adult education programme. It was last assigned 16000 Adult Education Centres and 1500 Jan Shikshan Nilayams in 200 districts in 1988-89 & 1989-90. In accordance with the strategy of the National Literacy Mission for implementation of area specific and time specific plans for complete eradication of illiteracy, the Sangathan has been asked to submit a comprehensive plan which is yet to be received. Statement of accounts in respect of grant sanctioned to the Sangathan is reported to have been finalised and is in the process of submission. There is no reported case of mismanagement of funds.

Central directive for revision of pay scales of NDS Instructors

12. SHRI SAMAR MUKHERJEE: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have issued instructions to the States and U.T. Administrations for revision of the pay scales of the former National Discipline Scheme Instructors (NDSIs) to bring them at par with the teaching staff of the schools run by the Centre/U.T. Administrations from 1st January, 1967, till their absorption in the State services;

(b) whether it is a fact that the pay scales so offered pertain to the teaching staff of Primary Schools of Centre/U.T. Administrations;

(c) whether it is also a fact that the former N.D.S. Instructors were employed in the Middle/High/Higher Secondary Schools of the country and are still serving in these Schools; and

(d) if so, the reasons for denying them (NDSIs) the pay scales as applicable to the teaching staff of High/Higher Secondary schools of Centre/U.T. Administration, from 1st January, 1967, till their absorption in the State services?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA: (a) A Statement is enclosed. (See below).

(b) The pay scale of only one category of NDS Instruction i.e. the

Junior Grade I, which is Rs. 330-560 (as on 1.1.73) pertains to the teaching staff of the Primary School of Centre/U.T. Administrations.

(c) Yes, Sir. As per the information available with the Department several NDS Instructors are still working in such schools and the services of other are being utilised by State Governments as per their requirements.

(d) The position has been explained in the reply to part (a).

Statement

On the basis of the judgement on a writ petition filed by one of Junior Grade I Instructors in Karnataka High Court and as upheld by Supreme Court in its judgement dated the 20th December, 1985 in SLP No. 12335/85 it was decided vide Government of India letter No. 21-3/86-YS. IV, dated 19th May, 1986 to revise the pay scale of Junior Grade I N. D. S. Instructors as follows:
