#### Opening of regional office of national Book Trust

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) to (c) Presently, the Eastern Regional Office of the National Book Trust, India located at Calcutta caters to the needs of the North Eastern Region. The National Book Trust, India, however, propose in their Draft Eighth Five Year Plan that a sub-regional office for the North East should be set up at Guwahati headed by an Assistant Regional Manager.

#### Manufacture/Import of computers

(c) what is their licensed capacity/installed capacity and the actual production during the last three years?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (PROF. M. G. K. MENON): (a) Government have licensed a number of parties for creating a wide manufacturing base for production of micros, minis, super minis, engineering work stations and mainframe computer systems of various sizes. Foreign collaborations have been allowed and import of design and drawings are permitted on a liberal basis.
