Strategy for next Olympics

*168. SHRI MENTARY PADMANABHAM: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the damage being caused to various sports and games by the constant infighting in various sports associations and all India organisations;

(b) whether any stress has been given to enhance our international standing in various games and sports by devising methods of avoiding faction ridden sports bodies;

(c) whether strategy has been devised for the next Olympics to ensure a better performance for India; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The National Sports Policy 1984 calls upon Indian Sports Bodies to 'present a unified and cohesive image in keeping with the dignity of the Nation'. The Guidelines of the Government contained in 'Operation Excellence, 1988-90' have also provided for various objective systems, criteria and measures for the selection and coaching of elite sportspersons in identified disciplines, with potential for winning medals in international events, Nutritive diet and sports medicine inputs, appropriate international exposures as part of a well-conceived long-term plan of development engagement of foreign coaches and import of equipments, where considered imperative in the cause of such development, special attention to promising juniors and other such measures are also being taken. Bilateral exchanges

of coaches, sports psychologists, sportspersons, teams under Cultural Exchanges Programmes and Sports Protocols calculated to improve our international competitive status are also organised. International standard playing surfaces and athletic tracks are also sought increasingly to be provided. All such measures are directed towards enhancing our international standing.

(c) and (d) While sports disciplines having medal winning potential in international tournaments/championships have generally been identified and training of athletes is in full swing with the objective of participation in Beijing Asian Games, 1990, a similar appropriate approach is under consideration for our participation in next Olympics. The strategy can be finalised after the Beijing Asian Games in the light of the experience gained, lessons learnt and results achieved.
