Manufacturing of Commercial Aircraft by H.A.L., Bangalore

1525. SHRI PASUMPON THA. KIRUTTINAN: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the H.A.L., Bangalore has launched a global hunt for partners for manufacturing commercial aircraft;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether it is also a fact that feelers have been sent to several leading aircraft and subsystem manufacturers abroad; and

(d) if so, the names of the manufacturers and the results achieved so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (DR RAJA RAMANNA): (a) and (c) No, Sir.

(b) and (d) Does not arise.

Setting up an Institute of Management in Assam

1526. SHRI BHADRESWAR BURAGOHAIN: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to set up an Institute of Management in Assam on the pattern of those in Ahmedabad, Calcutta and Bangalore;

(b) if so, whether the said Institute would be set up during the Eighth Five Year Plan; and

(c) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) Taking into account the stage of development of the four Indian Institutes of Management located at Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Calcutta and Lucknow, the Government feels that it is necessary to fully develop these institutes before starting any new Institute.

Proposal for Non-Imposition of any Duty on Imported Forest based Raw

1527. DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal under consideration of Government not to impose any duty on imported forest based raw materials in order to increase the area of our forests significantly; and

(b) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY): (a) and (b) Import of forest based raw materials has been liberalised and the same have been placed on Open General Licence. The import duty on rough logs is 10 per cent and that on sawn timber is 60 per cent.

Consumption of fuel wood in the country

1528. DR. RATNAKAR PANDEY: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) what is the annual consumption of fuel wood in the country at present; and

(b) what steps have been taken by Government to save fuel wood?

THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI NILAMANI ROUTRAY): (a) Annual demand for fuel in the country as assessed by the Forest Survey of India during 1987 is 235 million cubic metres and the recorded production for forests is 40 million cubic metre.

(b) Steps taken by Government to save fuel wood are:—

(i) Alternate sources of energy are being developed to replace fuelwood in domestic and commercial sectors.
