KRISHNAN): (a) and (b) The Delhi Traffic Police undertook a drive to check pollution levels in automobiles to bring in awareness in the minds of the vehicle-owning public to maintain their vehicles in conformity with the prescribed emission level standards. In the Union Territory of Delhi. checking was carried out mainly the Directorate of Transport. result of the drive cannot be quantified easily. A sample survey of dieseldriven vehicles conducted April-July, 1990 by Directorate Transport, Delhi Administration veals that out of 834 private vehicles. 82.87% vehicles were polluting above the laid down standards. In the case of Government vehicles, out of 3336 number of vehicles checked, 51.4% vehicles were found polluting above the prescribed standards.

- Transport (c) The Directorate of have intimated that during April-July 1990, 585 Government vehicles out of which 376 belong to DTC, have been challaned.
- (d) The total number of vehicles checked by Directorate of Transport till 30.6.90, has been 516712. these, 34% vehicles were found pollimits luting beyond the emission prescribed under the Rules.

Activities of ULFA

1737. SHRI V. NARAYANASAMY: SHRI SURESH PACHOURI: SHRI RAMDAS AGARWAL: SHRI GURUDAS DAS-GUPTA:

HOME Minister of Will the AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the ULFA cadres in Assam have pletely paralysed the administration and the AGP Government could not tackle the law and order problem in the State; and

(b) if so, what is the action plan proposed by Government to supress the activities of ULFA in Assam?

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI SUBODH KANT SAHAY): (a) No. Sir. ULFA's activities, however, are causing concern to the Government.

(b) The State Government are taking necessary action to curb the activities of ULFA. The State Government have also initiated action. which includes gearing up of adminis trative machinery, raids on hideouts, mobile and static checkings of hicles, etc. The Central Government are providing necessary assistance to the State Government.

Appeal from scientists to Governments of India and Pakistan

1738. SHRI MURLIDHAR CHAN-DRAKANT BHANDARE:

SHRI MAHENDRA PRASAD:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that over 100 Indian scientists have recently urged the Governments of India and Pakistan to banish nuclear weapons from this part of the world; and
- (b) if so, what is Government's information about the Pakistan Government's response thereto; and is Government's reaction thereto?

MINISTER OF STATE: IN THE OF EXTERNAL MINISTRY THE AFFAIRS (SHRI HARI KISHORE SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Government of India do Lelieve that the problem posed nuclear weapons can be solved on a bilateral or regional basis as the threat posed by these weapons has a global dimension. There is no information as to the Pakistan Government's response to the appeal from the group of scientists.
