- (c) According to the information furnished by University Grants Commission, the Commission has relea; ed an amount of Rs. 13. 14 crores for construction of buildings and campus since 1975-76.
- (d) and (e) According to the information by the University, State police furnished has been involved in investigation related to a few instances of theft and other crimes in Shillong Campus. State police have also investigated the murder of Dr. S. C. Banwar, Acting Vice-Chancellor, in 1981, and is currently investigating the murder of Dr. M. C. Joshi, Dean, School of Agricultural Sciences and Rural Development, Medziphema in Nagaland. All the six accused in the murder of Dr. Banwar were discharged. In Dr. Joshi's case;, the investigation is still not completed.

CBI was involved in 1985 in the investigation regarding irregularities and defalcation worth Rs. 51. 39 lakhs in the purchase of Damp Proof Sealing Cement. Three Officers were chargesheeted, and the case against them is pending in the High Court. 3 Officers against who_m CBI recommended departmental action have since been acquitted.

CBI recommended in 1988 Departmental proceeding against an Asstt. Engineer for recording exaggerated measurements of work in construction of Ring Road creund the permanent campus, thereby causing a loss of Rs. 1. 27 lakhs to the University. Departmental proceeding are! in progress.

CBI trapped two Medical Officers of the University in December 1989 for charging consultation fee even though were drawing non-practicim; allowance. CBI has recommended deoartmental proceedings against both the Officers.

CBI was also involved in a raid in December 1989 on the Engineering Cell

in connection with the stores of the University. CBI has recommended departmental action against the Junior Engineer in charge of the store. The University has asked for the Engineer's explanation.
