

ister of India and Prime Minister Krishna Prasad Bhattarai of Nepal signed a Joint Communiqué at the end of the Nepalese Prime Minister's visit to India. The Joint Communiqué provided for restoration of *status quo ante* as on April 1, 1987 in the relations between the two countries. This was to be pending finalisation of a comprehensive arrangement covering all aspects of bilateral relations. All the necessary steps to be taken by both Governments to implement this were specified in the two annexure to the Communiqué. Both sides committed themselves to ushering in a new era of bilateral cooperation, especially in the fields of industrial and human resources development, for harnessing of the waters of common rivers for the benefit of the two peoples and for the protection and management of the environment. The security concerns of both sides were also duly addressed in the Joint Communiqué. Both sides reaffirmed their desire not only to normalise Indo-Nepal relations, but to impart to them new dimensions and dynamism.

Bridges in Rajasthan

THE MINISTER OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI K. P. UNNIKRISHNAN): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The proposal for construction of a high level bridge on Ujhar river on State Highway No. 19 in Rajasthan re-

ceived in April, 89, has not yet been taken up for approval for want of the actual augmentation of the Central Road Fund against which the proposal was sent.
