1437. DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

Non-crediting of CDS Amount in respect of School Teachers in Delhi

(a) whether it is a fact that Deputy Controller of Accounts, Principal Accounts Officer (PAO-7) Vikas Bhawan, New Delhi have expressed concern over non-credit of new CDS amount in respect of teachers of 26 schools including Government Boys Higher Secondary School, Chhawla, Delhi;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; the amount involved and the names of the schools; and

(c) what action Government propose to take in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) to (c) Yes, Sir. The total amount involved is Rs. 78,965.55 and this includes Rs. 10,965.55 in respect of Government Boys Senior Secondary School, Chhawla. The names of 26 Schools are in the attached Statement. (See below.) The Principals of the concerned schools have been directed by the Delhi Administration to explain and

account for the delay in crediting new CDS amount in respect of teachers of 26 schools.

Recommendations of Bhujanga Rao Committee

1439. SHRIMATI BIJOYA CHAKRAVARTY: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to refer to answer to Starred Question 115 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 8th May, 1990 and state:

(a) what are the recommendations of the Bhujanga Rao Committee regarding introduction of new elective subjects at plus two stage; and

(b) whether it is a fact that all the subjects provided for in KVS are taught in all Kendriya Vidyalayas at all levels?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) The recommendations of the Committee are presented in the Statement (See below.)

(b) The subjects provided for in Kendriya Vialayas upto Class X are taught uniformly in all Kendriya Vidyalayas. The subjects taught in XI & XII classes vary from Vidyalaya to Vidyalaya depending on the streams opened, keeping in view the requirements.

Statement

Recommendations of the Bhujanga Rao Committee

1. Art Education Visual and performing which includes (music)

Physical Education may be offered as elective subjects at +2 stage

2. In view of the transferability of the parents and mobility of students it is recommended that subjects mentioned in (1) above may be offered at selected Kendriya Vidyalayas among a cluster, preferably where some hostel facilities are available.
3. In view of recommendation (2) above it will be essential to create the posts of PGT's in these subjects, i.e. Art Education and Physical Education.
4. The existing PETs and Art teachers and Music Teachers (Art Teacher Performing) if otherwise qualified, may be considered for promotion upto permissible number of vacancies of PGTs in these posts. The rest of the posts may be filled by open selection.
5. Existing Music Teachers (Art teachers performing) are in the scale of primary teachers. Now since Music will be part of Art Education (Performing art) and will be taught upto Class X as a compulsory subject, the Music Teachers should be in the scale of TGT.
6. As such the existing Music teachers, if otherwise qualified for the cadre of TGT, may be considered for this scale. Music teacher (in the scale of TGT), if otherwise qualified, may further be considered for promotion/selection for the post of PGT (Music), provided Music is offered at +2 stage as an elective subject in KVs.
7. Physical Education Teachers, Art Teachers, SUPW teachers and Music Teachers (Art teachers performing) may be considered for promotion through DPC for higher posts in other subjects if they acquired necessary qualifications
