A Technical Committee constituted by Department of Atomic Energy has also sought proposals of additional possible sites from Kerala State Electricity Board.

Literate Women in Educationally Backward' States

- (a) whether Government have as sessed the number cf literate women in educationally backward JStates;
- (b) whether this number has risen during the last decade; and
- (c)' what steps have been taken or contemplated to further raise this number?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA); (a) and (b) The literacy data is collected through decennial census. The last census was held in 1981. A statement is attached showing the number of literate women in the ten educationally backward States according to the 1971 and 1981 census. (See below.)

- (c) Keeping in view the policy for removal of disparity in access to edu cational opportunity suffered by men, several strategies have itiated recently to promote women's education throughout the country with emphasis on women in rural and tribal areas. Some of these are as under: -->
- (i) Mahila Samakhya; The basic thrust of this programme is to create

a mechanism whereby women are given an opportunity to plan and monitor their own education and reach out to a new body of Knowledge. It aims at involving women in the process of educational planning at the village level and providing educational toouta like; non-lormal education centres, training of village school teachers and production of eucational material. This project has been launched in 10 districts. 3 each of Guiarat and Karnataka and 4 of Uttar Pradesh.

(ii)- School Education; in the school education, measures taken to promoting education of the uis include recruitment of more », omen

teachers for primary scho-

Is, incentive schemes like distribution of free textbooks and uniforms, free education to girls upto Class Vill in all government, local body and aided schools, and upto Class X in most of the States/Union Territories.

- (jii) Non-Formal Education: Ninety per cent assistance is released by the Central Government for running of Non-formal' Education Centres for girl's in the 10 educationally backward States, the remaining 10 per cent being met by the State Government concerned.
- (iv) Adult Education: Specific steps taken to enlarge coverage of

women in adult education programme include: -r

- mobilisation of women learners to generate an anvironHient to ensure enrolment of at least 50 per cent women ir. adult education centres;
- appointment of larger number of women adult education functionaries such as Instructors and Preraks even &y relaxing the existing minimum educational qualifications;
- involvement of a large number of voluntary agencies especially those working for women;
- more attention by Shr'amik Vidyapeeths to women workers; special orientation and training of women Instructors as effective agents for promoting women's equality;
- provision of opportunities, retention of literacy skills and application of this learning for improving their living conditions;
- involvement of Central and State Social Welfare Boards with adult education programmes; and
- production of films on female literacy and empowerment, their telecast through Doordarshan.

The State Governments have been advised to take action accordingly.

THE MINISTER OF STATE, IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTER OF PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION (SHRI BHAGEY GOBARDHAN): (a) Yes,

- (b) The main demands relate to revision of pay scales from 1-1-1986 and introduciton of Central Government Dearness Allowance formula.
- (c) The Supreme Court has passed orders for implementing the reriort of the High Power Pay Committee for grant of Central Dearness Allowance formula to those employees in Central Public Sector Undertakings who as per letters of appointment or as per rules laid down by public sector enterprise are being paid Central Dearness Allowance, There are 68 Public Sectpr Undertakings covered by this order, covering 1, 75, 000 employees out of 2, 2. 5 lakhs employees in the entire public sector.
- (d)' Discussions are being held with the officers to explain the position and prevailing upon them to give up the proposed strike.
