(c) if so, th reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) A copy of the norms is at annexed. (See below)

(b) and (c) In accordance with the existing policy of the Sangathan, consequent upon upgradation of a Vidyalaya to class IX, two posts of Post Graduate Teachers (one language and one maths.) are sanctioned. This results in reduction of work for Trained Graduate Teachers load withdrawing which necessiates some teachers. Efforts are made adjust these teachers, if possible, Kendriya Vidyalayas in in other station against Graduate Teachers' vacancies or the nearby Kendriya Vidyalayas.
