(c) if so, th reasons therefor ?

(SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA):

(a) A copy of the norms is at annexed. (See below)

(b) and (c) In accordance with the existing policy of the Sangathan, consequent upon upgradation of a Vidyalaya to class IX, two posts of Post Graduate Teachers (one language and one maths.) are sanctioned. This results in reduction of work load for Trained Graduate Teachers which necessiates withdrawing of some teachers. Efforts are made to adjust these teachers, if possible, in other Kendriya Vidyalayas in the same station against Trained Graduate Teachers' vacancies or in the nearby Kendriya Vidyalayas.

NORMS FOR DETERMINATION OF STAFF STRENGTH OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA

A: TEACHING STAFF

(i) Here 48 is the number periods per class per week i. e. 8 periods a day; and

(ii) 36 is the number of periods a Primary Teacher takes in a week.

(c) **SUPER VISORY STAFF** (Headmaster)

A post of Head Master may be given to those KVs which fulfil one of the two undermentioned conditions:

(i) Which have both Primary and Secondary departments and where the total enrolment is more than 700;

GO Where the Primary classes are located in seperate building away from the main school or are functioning in a different shift.

(A Head Master will, however, take only 16 periods in a week in addition to his own duties of supervision).

(d) *EXAMPLE:*

(a) If there are 10 sections in classes I to V, in KVs which are not entitled to the post of Head Master in terms of the conditions referred to above, the number of Primary Teachers including one Music Teacher would be $10 \times 48/36 = 40/3 = 13$; say 12 Primary Teachers and 01 Music Teachers.

(b) If there are 10 sections in classes I to V in KVs as at (a) and (b) above, the strength of PRTs including one each Head Master and Music Teacher would be calculated in the following manner;
