- (b) whetrer it is also a fact that it is obligatory to submit break up of price decontrolled medicines before increase in prices;
- (c) if so, what are the names of medicines and their manufacturers who are enjoying more than 150 per cent MAPE alongwith the ex-factory cost and MAPE enjoyed in each case; and
- (d) what was the price of each medicine in July, 1987 and on 15th April, 1990?
