

APPROPRIATION BILL, 1990

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE
(**PROF. MADHU DANDAVATE**):
Madam, I move:

"That the Bill to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of India for the services of the financial year 1989-90, as passed by the Lok Sabha, be taken into consideration."

The question was put and the motion was adopted.

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: We shall now take up clause-by-clause consideration of the Bill.

Clauses 2 and 3 and the Schedule were added to the Bill.

Clause 1, the Enacting Formula and the Title were added to the Bill

"I am directed to inform you that the Criminal Law Amendment (Amending) Bill, 1989, which was passed by Rajya Sabha at its sitting held on the 22nd December, 1989 has been passed by Lok Sabha at its sitting held on the 29th March, 1990, with the following amendments:—

Enacting Formula

1. Page 1, line 1,—

for "Fortieth" substitute "Forty first"

Clause 1

2. Page 1, line 4,—

for "1989" substitute "1990"

2. I am, therefore, to return herewith the said Bill in accordance with the provisions of rule 121 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Lok Sabha with the request that the concurrence of Rajya Sabha in the said amendments be communicated to Lok Sabha."

Madam, I lay a copy of each of the Bills on the Table.
