

(c) whether Government have under their consideration any proposal in this regard ; and

(d) if so, what are main the features thereof and if not, the reasons therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (AJIT SINGH) : (a) to (d) The revision of scales of pay of executives who are on Industrial DA pattern is due mostly from 1-8-87 except for Fertilizer Group, where these are due from 1-8-86. The parameters, on the basis of which revision of scales of pay and allowances of these executives would be permitted are being evolved by the Government. Decision in this regard would be taken by Government shortly.

Supply of crude oil and petroleum products by USSR

612. SHRI K. V. THANGKABALU: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have requested the Soviet Union to raise the supply of crude oil and other petroleum products during the current financial year;

(b) if so, what is the additional quantity agreed upon to be supplied;

(c) whether the Soviet Union has impressed upon India to expedite the completion of the Karnal and the Mangalore Refineries;

(d) if so, what are the details in this regard;

(e) whether any alternative arrangements have also been made to meet the demand in the country; and

(f) if so, what are the details thereof ;

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS (SHRI M. S. GURUPADASAMY): (a) and (b) The import of crude oil and petroleum products from the Soviet Union is governed by the annual Indo-USSR Trade Plan. For 1989 this protocol provided for an import of 4.5 million tonnes of crude oil and 2.85 million tonnes of petroleum products. In 1990 the Soviet Union was requested to increase these quantities but they were unable to do so and the Trade for 1990 also provides for the import of 4.5 million tonnes of crude oil and 2.85 million tonnes of petroleum products from USSR.

(c) and (d) No Soviet assistance is envisaged for the proposed Mangalore Refinery Project. On the proposed Karnal Refinery Project, there has been a continuing dialogue between the Indian and Soviet organisations for finalisation of the terms and extent of Soviet assistance for the project.

(e) and (f) Yes Sir, the gap between demand and supply of crude oil and petroleum products will be met through imports from other countries.

Wing damage to Boeing hushed up

(d) if so, what are the details of the said report and what action has been taken by Government against the erring officials; and
