Sino-Indian border dispute

*127. DR. BAPU KALDATE:
Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether any fresh talks are proposed to be held with China to resolve the Sino-Indian border dispute; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI I. K. GUJRAL): (a) and (b) The boundary question is a subject of continuing discussion between the Governments of India and China. The India-China Joint Working Group on the boundary question has been established to address this question. Government's efforts are directed at reaching a fair, reasonable and mutually acceptable settlement of the boundary question with China, consistent with our national interests.

Private entrepreneurs to construct Highways

THE MINISTER OF SURFACE TRANSPORT WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI K. P. UNNIKRI-SHNAN): (a) and (b) Government had in July, 1985 by a public notice invited proposals from private sector for undertaking the construction of national highways at their cost but no satisfactory response was received. Government are prepared to consider such proposals.

(c) It is to increase the investment in national highways by supplementing the budgetary resources.

U.S. protest against India's action in Srinagar

(b) The Government has conveyed to the US Ambassador in New Delhi its concern at the iniquitous statement made by the State Department spokeswoman.
