(c) and (d) As on 1st December, 1989 the posts of Chairman, State Bank of India, Executive Directors of Bank of India, Canara Bank and Bank of Maharashtra, Managing Director, National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) and Chairman-cum-Managing Director National Insurance Company Limited were vacant. All the above vacancies except the Chairman-cum-Managing Director, National Insurance Company Limited and Executive Director, Bank of Maharashtra have since been filled up. Government have already initiated the process for filling up of the above two vacancies.

Expansion/Diversification of processed foods industry

1216. SHRI GHUFRAN AZAM: Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry has urged Government for substantial expansion and diversification of processed foods industry during the Eighth Five Year Plan period; and

(b) if so, what is Central Government's reaction thereto?

Purchase of tomatoes by the Punjab Agro and Pepsico in Punjab

1217. SHRI SUBAS MOHANTY: Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) how many tons of potatoes and grains from Punjab are being utilised by the Pepsico Project in the first year of operation;

(b) what amount have been passed on to the Punjab farmers from such arrangements;

(c) how many tons of tomatoes are being lifted for the project for making tomato paste; and

(d) at what price tomatoes are being bought from the farmers in Punjab?

THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SHRI SHARAD YADAV): (a) and (b) According to the information furnished by M/s. Pepsi Foods Private Limited the estimated quantum of potatoes and grains which are being utilised by them in the first year of operation is about 4,000 tonnes. Pepsi Foods plans to procure most of its agricultural raw material requirements directly from the farmers. It has been indicated that they are currently paying Rs. 1.35 per kg. for potatoes delivered to the factory and the total amount received by the Punjab farmers will depend upon the quantity supplied by them to the factory.

(c) and (d) According to M/s. Pepsi Foods Private Limited in the first year of operation the project has contracted to lift about 35,000 tonnes of tomatoes from the Punjab farmers. It has been indicated that the prices agreed range from Rs. 600 per tonne to Rs. 850 per tonne depending on the time of delivery at the factory. It has also been stated that to help farmers, Pepsi Foods has provided hybrid varieties of seedlings free of cost.
