1345. SHRI SURESH PACHOURI: Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) what are the details regarding Prime Minister's National Highways Development Project;

(b) whether any targets have been fixed under the project; and

(c) if so, the details thereof and achievements made so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS [MAJ. GEN. (RETD.) B.C. KHANDURI]:

(a) The Prime Minister's National Highways Development Project (NHDP) involves four/six laning of the National Highways connecting the four metros of Delhi-Kolkata-Chennai and Mumbai and North-South and East-West Corridors-connecting Srinagar to Kanyakumari and Silchar to Porbandar.

(b) Yes Sir.

(c) NHDP has a total length of 13151 kms. comprising 5851 kms. of Golden Quadrilateral (GQ) and 7300 kms. of North-South & East-West Corridors (Corridors). Four-laning of 1063 kms. of Golden Quadrilateral and 716 kms. of Corridors has been completed. The GQ of NHDP is likely to be completed by December 2003 and the Corridors of NHDP by December 2007.
