Wholesale and retail prices of essential commodities

Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

(a) what were the retail and wholesale prices of essential commodities such as wheat, rice, tea, sugar, mustard oil and vegetable oil and kerosene oil monthwise during the last six months; and

(b) measures taken to bring down the prices?

THE MINISTER OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI NATHU RAM MIRDHA): (a) A statement showing the months-wise average retail prices and whole sale price indices of specified essential commodities from September, 1989 to February, 1990 is given in Annexure. [See Appendix CLIII, Annexure No. 97].

(b) The Government has accorded highest priority to check the rising trend in prices of essential commodities. Both long term and short term measures are being taken for the purpose. The measures taken by the Government broadly

include steps to increase production of essential commodities like sugar, edible oils and tea etc. which are in short supply, effective procurement and buffer stocking operations of foodgrains, strengthening of Public Distribution System, monitoring of prices and availability situation, strict enforcement of the provisions of the Essential Commodities Act and other regulatory measures and augmenting domestic supplies through imports, wherever necessary, so as to check any abnormal rise in the prices of essential commodities.
