State funding of elections

*66. SHRI MURLIDHAR CHANDRA-KANT BHANDARE: Will the Minister of LAW AND JUSTICE be pleased to state:

(a) what steps are being contemplated towards effecting electoral reforms, as declared by the new ruling party in their election manifesto issued on the eve of the last Lok Sabha Elections, especially State funding of elections; and

(o) whether it would be possible to enforce State funding of elections for the Legislative Assemblies where elections are due shortly; if so, what are the broad features of the relevant scheme?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE AND TOURISM (SHRI ARUN KUMAR NEHRU): (a) Yes, Sir. Government of India is aware of reports appearing in the press to this effect.

(c) Government of India has repeatedly made it clear that it will not participate in any negotiations, bilateral or otherwise under threat of retaliation.
