(b) Several rounds of talks were held on the charter of demands submitted by the employees' unions in 1977. They failed in 1980. Fresh demands were raised by the unions in 1983-84 and the pay scales and other benefits of Clerical & Supervisory and Subordinate employees of LIC were revised by a Notification issued by the Government on 11-4-1985.

(c) Several rounds of talks were held with employees' unions for further revision of pay scales and other benefits in 1988 and 1989 and the revision has been notified by the Government on 12-5-1989 giving effect to the revision from 1-8-1987.

Review of collaboration arrangements with Pepsi Cola

331. SHRI YASHWANT SINHA: SHRI SURENDRA SINGH THAKUR:

(c) No separate policy has been laid down for foreign collaboration in Food Processing Industries. Each proposal for foreign collaboration in the field of processed food industries is considered on its merits.

New food processing industries in backward areas of the country

332: SHRI B. SATYANARAYAN REDDY: Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state the new measures being considered by Government t_0 have new food processing industries in the country, especially in backward areas, to provide employment opportunities to the unemployed?

MINISTER OF TEXTILES THE WITH ADDITIONAL CHARGE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOOD PROCES-SING INDUSTRIES (SHRI SHARAD YADAV): Various incentives are being given for the development of small scale industries included food processing industries in the rural and backward areas. Government have established the Ministry of Food Processing Industries whose objectives include development of a network of processing units in the rural areas which would create increased job opportunities for the unemployed.

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI MANOBHAI KOTADIA): (a) 36 major and 27 medium on-going irrigation projects of VII plan have been techno. economically appraised and placed before the advisory committee for recommending them to the Planning Commission. Besides, 12 major and 2 medium ongoing projects received from the States from time to time are under process of examination with the Central Water Commission.

(b) Compliance of the observations made by the Central appraisal agencies are processed through discussions to expedite the clearance.

Effecting Change in the legal system for ' providing speedy justice

The steps taken proposed to be taken in this direction include removing imbalances in the demand and supply of essential commodities, mapping up excess liquidity in the economy and vigorous enforcement of existing laws against hearding and profiteering. The Government is determined to contain fiscal deficit by appropriate measures to increase revenue and reduce expenditures. Measures taken preposed to be taken to improve foreign exchange position and improve the external imbehance include efforts to maintain the tempo of export growth and curtail inessential imports.

' Development of Tourism
