The other Secretary-level meetings are evisaged during the next eight weeks. All these will be held during the first half of 1989 as agreed during the meeting between our Prime Minister and Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto.

The Joint Commission is expected to identify areas of cooperation in the fields of trade, economic cooperation, education, culture, information, sports. travel, tourism and consular matters. Defence Secretary, Hom_e Secretary and Foreign Secretary level talks will focus on Siachen, the problem of terrorism, and bilateral and other issues respectively.

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RE-SOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI P. SHRI SHANKER): (a) to (c) The literacy data in the country are collected through decennial census. The present number of illiterates in the country will be known only after the next census is held in 1091.

(d) and (e) The National Literacy fission Authority (NLMA) was constituted in June, 1988 to administer the National Literacy Mission. It is an independent and autonomous wing of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Education) vested with full executive and financial powers in its sphere of working- It is the operating and implementing agency at the national level for all the activities envisaged in National Literacy Mission.

National Literacy MisBibn Authority has a Council headed by the Minister, Human Resource Development and an Executive Committee headed by the Union Education Secretary. Both Official and non-official members are represented o_n. these two bodies. The Executive Committee, carries, out all the functions of the Authority in accordance with the policy and guidelines laid down by the Council.

Strengthening of fcdmmistrative, academic and technical resource and media support, simplification of procedures and financial assistance to a good number of Voluntary Agencies, involvement of teachers, students, youth, women, ex-servicemen, prison management and staff and adoption of area specific plans and projects for complete eradication of illiteracy in specific areas and development of

techno-pedagogiq input $_{\rm a}$ on a large scale ar $_{\rm e}$ some of the significant achievements of the National Literacy Mission.
