- (d) what are the conditions on which this loan has been received?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIA-TION AND TOURISM (SHRI SHIV-RAJ PATIL): (a) Yes, Sir. (b) to (d) In order to finance the purchase of 19 Airbus A 320 aircraft, Indian Airlines has, with the approval of the Government, signed an Agreement on the 23rd of March, 1989 with the Japanese bank for a loan of US \$ 200 million. THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI P. V. NARASIMHA RAO): (a) to (c) The Afghanistan Government had requested India for relief assistance. As on 22nd April, 1989, assistance worth about Rs. 27

lakhs consisting of medicines, vanaspati, tea and sugar had been sent by India to Kabul through the Indian Airlines in Ariana Airlines aircraft.

(d) According to available information, mainly Soviet and Indian relief supplies have so far reached Kabul.
