

Wastage of Fruits and Vegetables due to Improper Post Harvest handling

1363. SHRI MUKHTIAR SINGH MALIK : Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the news item which appeared in the Times of India of the 21-2-1989 wherein it has been stated that fruits and vegetables worth Rs. 3,000 crores are wasted every year due to improper post harvest handling ;

(b) if so, the quantity of fruits and vegetables wasted during the last three years, year wise and the reasons therefor ; and

(c) what steps have since been taken by Government to avoid such wastage ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COOPERATION IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI SHYAM LAL YADAV) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) No official estimates are available.

(c) A separate Department of Food Processing Industry has been established to encourage food processing. The National Horticulture Board is implementing schemes for reducing post harvest losses. A Central Cold Storage facility with grading and packing facilities has been established by National dairy Development Board under which 135 outlets for distribution of fruits and vegetables in Delhi have been set up.

(b) if so, the names of areas and crops where the farmers during the last year have got that much of profit keeping in view the labour of his family members and others, the interest on his investment and other liabilities that he had to incur during the farming period of the crop ?
