

Nutritional deficiency among children

1750. DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state :

(a) what is the percentage of incidence of Nutritional deficiency among infants in urban and rural areas of the country;

(b) what are the effects of Nutritional deficiency among infants; and

(c) what steps are being taken to prevent Nutritional deficiency disease?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI SAROJ KHAPARDE) : (a) Surveys carried out by the National Nutrition Monitoring Bureau/National Institute of Nutrition of the Indian Council of Medical Research in ten States of the country including rural and urban areas indicate that about 9 per cent of the infants manifest nutrition deficiency signs relating to protein energy, malnutrition ranging from two to four per cent in urban slums and one to three per cent in rural areas. Vitamin A deficiency are found in less than one per cent of infants.

(b) Nutritional deficiency affects the physical growth and can lead to mental retardation.

(c) The measures/programmes initiated to prevent nutritional deficiency disease in various Ministries are as under :—

—Development and promotion of Nutrition, foods like Miltone, Energy foods, ready to eat extruded food and weaning foods.

—Fortification of Milk with Vit. A and fortification of salt with iron. (Ministry of Food and Civil Supplies).

—Integrated Child Development Services Scheme which include a major component of supplementary nutrition to children below 6 years, pregnant women and lactating mothers. (Department of Women and Child Development, M/O Human Resource Development).

—Mid-day meal programmes for school going children in the age group 6—11 (some State Governments).

—A Centrally Sponsored Programme of wheat based supplementary nutrition for children upto 5 years of age, pregnant women and lactating mothers, particularly in tribal areas and urban Slums (Ministry of Women and Child Development).

—Prophylaxis Programme to prevent nutritional anaemia in mothers and children and for prevention of blindness due to Vitamin A deficiency. Fortification of salt with iodine to prevent iodine deficiency disorders and promotion of breast feeding during infancy. (Ministry of Health and Family Welfare).

—Nutrition Education Programmes (Several Ministries like Health and Family Welfare, Food and Civil Supplies).
