proposal to extend coverage to the entire State of Kerala is under preparation.

(b) The national literacy data is compiled only through decennial census. The following are the literacy percentages in the given areas as per the 1981 census :

(Greater) Bombay	68.18%
Calcutta (Urban agglomeration)	69.12%
Delhi (Do.)	61.54%
Madras (Do.)	68.40%
Gujarat	43.70%
Kerala	70.42%

The growth rate for the decennial period 1981-91 as a whole would be available after the next census due in 1991.

(a) whether the Government of India have urged the Government of Sri Lanka to postpone the Referendum in Eastern Province of Sri Lanka ; and

(b) if so, what is the reaction of the Government of Sri Lanka thereto ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. NATWAR SINGH) : (a) and (b) On 29th December, 1988 the Sri Lankan Government announced the postponement of the Referendum from 31st December, 1988, to 5th July, 1989. Government
