Pakistan's threat to denuclearisation

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a new study 'Janes Strategic Weapons Systems' published from London, as reported in the Hindustan Times of May 10, 1989 under the caption "Study: Pak threat to denuclearisation"; and

(b) if so, what is Government's assessment about the Pakistani and Israeli threat to the process of denuclearisation, in view of the fact that these two countries which are outside the NATO and Warsaw Pacts possess both ballistic missiles and nuclear technology?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI P. V. NARASIMHA RAO): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The nuclear and missile programmes of both Pakistan and Israel, dedicated to weapons development, is a matter of deep concern to Government which is closely following development in this regard.

(b) if so, what are the reasons for not holding interviews for these posts while interviews for the posts of PGTs advertised alongwith these have already been concluded;

(c) whether the delay has adversely affected teaching work of the Kendriya Vidyalayas; and

(d) if so, by when the interviews are likely to be held?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI P. SHIV SHANKER): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) to (d) Interviews for the posts of Post Graduate Teachers are still continuing. Those for Trained Graduate Teachers would be conducted by Regional Offices shortly.
