

have athletic tracks, play fields for football, hockey, volleyball and a basketball court, indoor halls for physical conditioning, weight lifting and gymnastics, and a sports hostel for 50 to 70 sports persons. Each Sports Project Development Area is expected to cover 80 to 100 Development Blocks in the State roughly covering 5 to 6 Districts or one Division, and act as a focal point for promotion of sports in an integrated manner in the Block covered by it.

Each Centre will specifically promote five olympic disciplines and also 1 or 2 indigenous games based on popularity and proficiency in the area facilities created etc.

Each Centre will cost about Rs. 1 crore excluding the cost of land which will be provided by the State Governments. Central and State Governments will provide financial assistance to the extent of Rs. 50 lakhs each for creation of required infrastructure facilities of SPDA Centres. The State Governments would be actively involved in the management of the SPDAs.

SHIV SHANKER): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir, the Ministry of Human Resource Development reserves seats in Engineering Colleges and Polytechnics recognised by All India Council for Technical Education for the States/Union Territories which do not have facilities for training in Engineering and Technology or which lack facilities for training in specific fields. Enforcement of Quality Control on Infants' Food.

2872. SHRI RAM AWADHESH SINGH: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is breakdown in enforcing quality control on Infants' Foods in the country;

(b) whether Government propose to ban all advertisements thereof; and

(c) if so, the number of samples which were drawn during the last one year, company-wise, indicating the quantity produced by each company and the number of packages produced?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS AND WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MATI MARGARET ALVA): (a) No such breakdown has come to the notice of the Government. The provisions of Prevention of Food Adulteration Rules 1955 enacted under the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954 takes care of the facilities of all types of infant foods. The State Governments/Union Territories who are primarily responsible for administering the PFA Act and Rules, in their respective zones, have been instructed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare from time to time to ensure that infant food marketed in their areas are in accordance with the provisions of the PFA Act, 1954. Penal action is taken in case the samples are found adulterated.
