SHRI EDUARDO FALEIRO: Yes, Sir. Representatives of farmers will be there. As far as working of the banks as such is concerned...

DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI: I would like to know whether the Government seeks police verification before appointing them as directors so that some shady personalities may not enter into the boards of directors of the banks.

SHRI EDUARDO FALEIRO: We will see that shady personalities as the Member calls them are not included. We will make a thorough check of them from all the agencies.

DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI: What about police clearance?

SHRI EDUARDO FALEIRO: We will take not merely the clearance of the police which may not be the best thing, but we will take the clearance of the agencies like the Revenue Intelligenc and other agencies which deal with these things.

DR. YELAMANCHILI SIVAJI: Will you at least take the clearance of the State Government?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Yes, Mr. Gautam.

We will endeavour to have representation of the Scheduled Caste in all the Board."

Long term policy on tea

*345. SHRI RATNA BAHADUR RAI: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Committee constituted by Government to formulate long-term policy on tea has submitted its report;

(b) if so, what are the recommendations of the Committee; and

(c) what action Government have taken thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE

Statement

- (a) Yes, Sir.
- (b) The main recommendations of the Committee are as follows:—
- to evolve a National Tea Policy;
 - to set up a Standing Forum for Policy Planning and Co-ordination for tea;
 - to set up a Centre for Studies in Plantation management system;
 - to devise policies and programmes for augmentation of productive capacities of the tea growing estates and keeping the tea areas in optimum state of productive health;
 - rejuvenation and infilling for increasing average yields as one of the medium-term remedies;
 - creation of a Tea Replanting Fund;
 - to motivate plantations, to undertake time bound larger programme of extension planting through requisite financial backing with attractive incentive packages;
 - extension of tea in degraded forest land;
 - growing of tea in non-traditional areas for progressive increase in production of tea;
 - revision of assistance packages after every three years by the Tea Board and the financial institutions;
 - programmed development of small growers sector;
 - to strengthen the R & D activities;
 - constitution of Regional Advisory Committees for the purpose of planning and development of the industry in the region concerned;

—region-wise manpower studies be initiated to make an objective assessment of the perspective on supply side vis-a-vis the projected requirements;

—institutionalized forum for centre-state co-ordination;

—review of role of the Tea Board in line with the future requirements of development;

—to evolve a plan and strategy for increasing export volumes, export earnings and for effecting substantial increasing in value added exports.

(c) Government is yet to examine the Report, as it has been received only recently.

SHRI RATNA BAHADUR RAJ: Sir, the Minister has stated in his reply that the Government is examining the recommendations of the Committee which was appointed 22 months ago. I am glad that the Committee has submitted its report and the Ministry is examining the recommendations in the report. But I would like to know from the honourable Minister whether, pending examination of the recommendations, the Government will consider the cases of the sick units and, secondly, whether the Government will consider the question of the falling price of tea in internal market keeping in view the increasing domestic consumption.

SHRI P. R. DAS MUNSHI: Sir, I am thankful to the honourable Member for the compliments that he has paid to the Ministry for appointing this Committee to formulate long-term policies and to make recommendations in that direction. I would like to inform the honourable Member that the recommendations are in this Report which is a voluminous Report dealing with all aspects of production, productivity, modern methods, research and so on. So, it will take much more time to consider the whole thing. So, unless we examine it in detail, we cannot, at the moment, say which are the parts which we will accept and which are the parts which we will not be able to accept. Insofar as the matter that was referred to by the honourable Member regarding sick units

is concerned, there is no decision as such. But it is a fact that going beyond the parameters of the long-term proposals, very recently, last month I had asked the Chairman of the Tea Board to prepare a report on the situation to find out whether the sick units, closed down units, can be improved, whether their capacity can be improved and whether they can be revived with help by the financial institutions to revive and reopen them. Unless we receive this report we cannot say anything now. Even after receiving the report, we will have to contact the other Ministries.

So far as price is concerned, we are concerned about the growing price of tea in the market. At the instance of the Commerce Minister, I have asked for a market survey report and have convened a meeting and I am glad to inform the House that the members of the tea trade themselves have agreed and have started a popular brand tea which would be sold within the range of forty rupees per kg. There is nothing here. We are not the nodal Ministry to monitor it. The State Governments, the Enforcement Departments and the Civil Supplies Departments are concerned with this and they are monitoring this. But the tea trade has responded to our call,

SHRI RATNA BAHADUR RAI: I would like to know whether the Government can spell out any time-limit for the examination of the recommendations of this Committee.

SHRI P. R. DAS MUNSHI: At the moment, I cannot specify any time-limit. We are very much concerned about the tea industry and in the interest of the country's economy and trade, we will look into the matter very shortly and instruct the Department to examine it as
