After the revision of pay their salary structure is lower than that of other university teachers. Secondly, the essential anomaly or difference between the medical college teachers in Pai^sthan and other teachers is not being set right, thereby disrupting not the just medical services of Rajasthan but the future of a large number of doctors in Rajasthan. This cannot be permitted to continue. 1 emoin upon the Union Health Minister to take urgent note of the situation and if for no other reason but for the sakeof teh health of Rajasthan. to intervene immediately.
