Allotment of rice and wheat to the State of Maharashtra

SHRI VISHWASRAO RAMRAO PATIL (Maharashtra): Madam Deputy Chairman, I want to raise a most important issue which is about increase in the monthly allotment of rice and wheat to the State of Maharashtra by the Central Government. The Maharashtra State is deficit in foodgrains and depends upon... (Interruptions)...

THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: May I request the honourable Members to listen to what the Special Mention is about?

SHRI VISHWASRAO RAMRAO PATIL: Madam, Maharashtra State is deficit in foodgrains production and depends upon the supplies from the Government of India. To meet the deficit the State depends upon the supplies from the Centre. The normal requirement of the State worked out, on the basis of actual off-take in respect of rice and wheat, to 85,000 tonnes and 125 000 tonnes respectively. Till January, 1988, we used to get 70 000 tonnes of rice. The Government of India, however, reduced the rice allotment in February 1988 from 70,000 tonnes to 60,000 tonnes. The wheat allotment was also reduced likewise from 1,00,000 tonnes to 80 000 tonnes in March 1988. The sizeable reduction in foodgrains allotment has adversely affected Maharashtra State's supply line vis-a-vis the public distribution system. After frequent requests, the Government
