In pursuance of this the establishment of a mechanism¹ for co-ordination among the varions Central agencies involved in the development of higher education in different fields is under discussion. The details of its composition, Functions, etc, have not been finlised,

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(b) As the proposed mechanism is in tended primarily to bring about greater coordination among the existing Central agencies no discussions with the State Goverments are envisaged.
