(c) whether any inquiry has been held in the case; if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI S. REGUPATHY): (a) to (c) Yes, Sir. One school girl was killed on 8th August, 2006 in an incident which occurred due to rash and negligent driving of a RTV by the conductor who did not have a valid driving licence. The conductor was allowed to drive the RTV by the driver/owner of the vehicle leaving the vehicle unmanned/unescorted with no one else to take care of the students. Delhi Police registered a case vide FIR No. 391/2006 at Police Station Timarpur and arrested the conductor. After completion of investigation, charge sheet has been filed in the court.
