

**Funds for detection and prevention of
Aids in Orissa**

967. KUMARI SUSHILA TIRIA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state;

(a) what are the details of the Central funds allocated to Orissa for detection and prevention of AIDS;

(b) whether ICMR would be directed to take active lead in the matter; and

(c) if not, what are the reasons for giving low priority to this health menace?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI SAROJ KHAPARDE): (a) Two surveillance centres for AIDS have been set-up in Orissa, one at the Regional Medical Research Centre at Bhubaneswar and the other at S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack. During 1986-87, the centres were provided with the necessary equipments needed for the screening. The personnel were trained to carry out the tests and a contingency grant was provided to take care of the expenses in sera collection and transport. A state of AIDS cell was also set up to take up the responsibilities of sera collection and follow-up among high risk groups. During the subsequent years, AIDS surveillance centres have been provided with a contingency grant commensurate with the work load in the centre.

(b) There had been periodic visits by ICMR staff to the centres to review and assist the centres. Guidelines for carrying out sera surveillance work and providing follow up care has been sent

to the surveillance centres and the State AIDS Officer.

(c) No. The AIDS surveillance activity has not been given low priority.

**Preference to foreign airlines by the air
traffic to South East Asia from Madras**

968. SHRI K. V. THANGKABALU: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a major segment of air traffic from Madras to South East Asia uses foreign airlines;

(b) if so, whether Government have studied the reasons for preference given to the airlines, other than Air India;

(c) whether discourtesy and inefficiency are the root causes of the lack of preference for Air India; and

(d) if so what steps are being taken to overhaul Air India?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM (SHRI SHIVRAT PATIL):

(a) and (b) Malaysian Airways and Singapore Airlines are carrying more traffic than Air India from Madras to South East Asia because:—

(i) Number of frequencies operated by two foreign airlines are more than those of Air India.

(ii) Air India has to carry traffic originating from Bombay also whereas the two foreign carriers operate to and from Madras only.

(iii) The two airlines are carrying Madras-South East Asia traffic not only to their own countries but also to their neighbouring countries.

(c) and (d) No. Sir. However, Air India has in the recent past taken several steps like improved ground handling and inflight service, computerisation to link up various agencies in its reservation system and automatic baggage and boarding pass labelling to speed up passenger handling and convenience.

Rating of Tamil Nadu in Family Planning Programme

969. SHRI K. V. THANGKABALU: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) what rating has been given to Tamil Nadu for its performance in Family Planning Programme;

(b) whether it is a fact that Tamil Nadu has been commended for its work in this field; and

(c) if so, what financial incentives have been given to that State during the Seventh Five Year Plan period for implementation of Family Planning Programme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI SAROJ KHAPARDE): (a) Based on the estimated Couple Protection Rate on account of Family Planning Performance as on 31st March, 1988 Tamil Nadu ranks 5th among 15 major States.

(b) and (c) Under the scheme of national awards to the States/UTs., for best performance in Family Planning, Tamil Nadu, in its group of States, has won 1st prize in which of the years 1985-86 and 1986-87, The annual amounts released to this State (including cash, awards) so far during the plan period for the implementa-

tion of Family Welfare Programme are as follows:

AIDS detection programme in Tamil Nadu

(a) whether Government have launched a programme to detect AIDS cases in Tamil Nadu;

(b) if so, what are the details of work done in this regard in that State; and

(c) what steps are being taken by ICMR in that State?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI SAROJ KHAPARDE): (a) The Government have launched an extensive programme for screening persons of high risk, groups and for this purpose surveillance centres have been established in Tamil Nadu as under:—

—Christiun Medical College, Vellore.
—Madras Medical College, Madras. —
Institute of Child Health, Madras. —
Madurai Medical College, Madurai. —
Apollo Hospital, Madras. —Jipmer.
Pondicherry.

An AIDS Cell with an officer-in-charge has also been established at the State Health Headquarters to coordinate the activities and to assist the centres in collection of Serum Samples from high risk group and follow up case.
