THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUP-PLIES (SHRI D. L. BAITHA): (a) A statement indicating the required information is attached (*see* below).

(b) and (c) The allocation of rice to Karnataka, which was 60,000 tonnes in January, 1988, was rationalised to 55,000 tonnes in February, 1988 and further *to* 45,000 tonnes in June, 1988. This level of allotment has been maintained for the months of July and August, 1988! As regard wheat, their allocation was 25,000 tonnes in February, 1988, 20,000 tonnes in March, 1988 and 15,000 tonnes per month from April 1988 onwards.
