Telecommunication facilities on sharing basis

*167. SHRI PARVATHANENI UP-ENDRA: Will the Minister of COM-MUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Department of Telecommunications has decided to provide telecommunication facilities on a sharing basis in multi-storeyed buildings and the buildings of group housing societies; and

(b) if so by when the scheme is likely to be launched?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICA-TIONS (SHRI BIR BAHADUR SINGH): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Instructions in this behalf have already been given to the field units and the scheme is being implemented progressively.

Expenditure on New Rajghat Thermal Plant

THE M'NISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF POWER IN THE MINISTRY OF ENERGY (SHRI KALPNATH RAI): (a) An expenditure of Rs. 159.25 crores has been incurred upto 31-7-1988.

(b) Upto 31-7-1988 an amount of Rs. 5.34 crores has been spent against an allocation of Rs. 45 crores for the year 1988-89

(c) The first unit is likely to be in operation by March, 1989 and the second unit by July, 1989. Proposal for the setting up of a Solar Power Station at Bangalore

(a) whether the Department of Non-Conventional Energy Sources has submitted a project report recently to the Planning Commission for the setting up of a 30 MW Solar Power Station at Bangalore;

(b) if so, whether the project has since been cleared by Government; and

(c) if not, what are the reasons for delay?

THE MINISTER OF ENERGY (SHRI VASANT SATHE): (a) to (c) A proposal for Bangalore has not been made; however proposals for setting up 30 MW Solar Power Stations have been made to the Planning Commission.
