Report of Committees Appointed for Promotion of Tourism

1896. DR. ABRAR AHMED KHAN: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whe ther it is a fact that to solve the various problems faced by the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism, Government had set up two separate commitees, one under the Chairmanship of the Cabinet Secretary and the other under the Chairmanship of Trade Fair Authority of India;
- (b) if so, what were the specific work, term and conditions of each-committee; and
- (c) whether the reports of both [the Committees have since been re ceived by Government and if so, what are the main recommendations of the Committee and the action taken Ly Government thereon?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE) (SHRI MOTI LAL VORA): (a) to (c) A National Committee on Tourism was set un by 1';! Planning. Commission in July, 1936 for formulating a long-term perspective plan -for the development of Touricm. The chairman, of t -.is Committee was Shri Mohammad Yunus, Chairman. Trade Fair Authority of jnrtia. The terms of reference of the Committee were the following:

- (i; Evaluate the economic and social relevance of international and domestic tourism of India.
- (".) Define the tourism product, its present and future variation keeping in view the market needs and d.'inrinds.
- iii Determinj tiie requirements balanced, integrated infrastructure &nd facilitation mewres to achieve the maximum consumer satisfaction.
- (iv) Develop a planned market strategy hased on scientific research and cf nststent with ongoing res-

ponses $_0\mathbf{f}$ the market needs through a realistic communication strategy.

to Questions

- (v) Determine and define the role of the Central Minisuies State governments, 'Public and Private Institutions in the promotion of tourism and suggest a mechanism for monitoring the performance of these-agdncies against the well defined economic yardstick.
- (vi) Assess the manpower needs for development of tourism sector and to recommend appropriate training programmes for manpower development.
- (vii) Recommend organisational and institutional measures to systematise long-term planning for the tourism sector on a sound, technical and economic basis.

The Committee submitted its report to the Government in June 1 his year. The main recommendations of the Committee can be broadly classified into the following 3 categories:

- 1. A package of incentives for mofivatin? private sector investment in tourism related activities.
- 2. Reorganisation of the Department of Tourism, India Tourism Development Corporation and the training institutes under the Department of Tourism.
- 3. Starategy' for rapid augmentation ₀f air and ground transportation capacity.

The recommendations made by the Committee are being-examined by the Government. No separate Committee has been set up under the chairmanship of the Cabinet Secretary. The Committee of Secretaries under the chairmanship ot the Cabinet Secretary meets as and when necessary to solve problems faced by am, Department.
