These, inter-alia include-(i) a package financial incentives for motivating private sector 1 investment in tourism related activities, (ii) re-organisation of the Department of Tourism, India Tourism Development Corporation an<j th« training institutes under the Department of Tourism, and (iii) a strategy for rapid augmentation of and ground transport capacity.
