Promotion of beach resorts along Western Coast

- 108. SHRI K V. THANGKABALU: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIA-TION AND TOURISM be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government are considering to conduct a survey of the entire Western Coast for promoting the beach resorts; and
- (b) if so, what are the details of the proposal?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIA-TION AND TOURISM (SHRI SHIV-RAJ PATIL): (a) and (b) The Government propose to conduct a Tourism Potential Survey of Western Ghats which will include most parts of Western Coast. The objectives of the study are the following:-

- (i) to prepare an inventory σf upto-date tourism resources Western Ghats.
- (ii) to assess the infrastructural facilities in each of the centres and its present level of utilisation.
- (iii) to identify the factors inhibiting the growth of tourism, both domestic and international, in this region.
- (iv) to assess the potential tourism demand, expected benefits and its socio-economic effects.
- (v) to suggest specific means for improving tourist inflow to the region and to out-line an investment programme designed to provide necessary tourist infrastructure facilities to meet the growth in demand.

The Government is now in the process of selecting a suitable agency for undertaking the survey
