ived for the exploitation of nodules. It is estimated that the production of commercially important metalls like copper, nickel, cobalt and manganese will be possible on a commercial scale by 2008—2009 AD.

Central Administrative Tribunal

- 292. SHRI HAVENDRA SINGH HANS-PAL: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) which was set up about two and a half years back to speed up disposal of Central Government employee's service disputes is presently facing an increased number of pending cases in its various benches;
- (c) the steps taken or proposed to be as on the 30th June, 1986; and
- (c) the steps taken or proopsed to be taken by Government?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRIP, CHIDAMBARAM): (a) Yes, Sir.

- (b) The total number of cases pending before various benches of the Central Administrative Tribunal as on 30-6-88 is 23,639.
- (c) Government have already decided to appoint more Vice-Chairmen and Members to the Central Administrative Tribunal. It has also been decided to open additional benches of the Central Administrative Tribunal at Jaipur and Lucknow with a view to facilitate speedy disposal of cases.

U. S. Military Aid to Pakistan
