THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM) : (a) and (b) In two cases drugs were recovered from the possession of two police Constables by the Vigilance Branch of Delhi Police. In another case, a woman Sub-Inspector has been arrested for harbouring a drug trafficker. 3 cases u/s. 21/61/85 NDPS Act, 1985 have been registered.

(c) Strict watch is being maintained in this regard and stern action is taken against such policemen according to law.

Attack on Minister of State for Home Affairs in Calcutta

The Chief Minister, West Bengal has regretted the incident and acknowledged the responsibility of the State Government for making adequate security arrangements during visit of Central Ministers to the States.
