

Teachers not suitable for teaching

†2739. SHRI SHATRUGHAN SINHA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the report of the World Bank wherein it has been stated that 50 per cent teachers in the country are not suitable for imparting proper education and 25 per cent teachers even do not come to schools;

(b) whether Government agree with the figures given in this report;

(c) if so, the steps being taken by Government to improve this situation; and

(d) if not, the factual position in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) to (d) As per a nation-wide survey undertaken by the researchers from the World Bank and Harvard University in 2004 that covered 3700 primary schools spread over 20 States in the country, teacher absence rate was found to be 25%. Further, only 45% of teachers were actively engaged in teaching at the time of visit. Under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, emphasis has been given on the role of Village Education Committees and local bodies in the monitoring and supervision of schools including attendance of teachers.

Amount for Bihar under SSA

(a) the amount allocated to Bihar out of the amount of Rs 10,041/- crores proposed for Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan in the budget 2006-07;

(b) whether it is a fact that the educationally backward States/regions be brought in the mainstream, has been kept in mind while allocating this amount;

(c) the share of Bihar in the proposed construction of 5,00,000 additional rooms and recruitment of 1,50,000 teachers; and

(d) to what extent Government's initiative towards the target of educating all children under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan is significant?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) and (b) An amount of Rs. 549.72 crore has been released by Government of India to Bihar under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan Programme so far in the current financial year. The educational backwardness of a State/region is considered while appraising annual district plans and allocating funds.

(c) The share of Bihar in the proposed construction of additional classrooms and recruitment of teachers is 106,669 and 80522 respectively.

(d) Significant progress has been made in reduction of out of school children in the 6-14 year age group, since the launch of the SSA programme.
