- (e) whether cell phone operators association had sought a uniform licence fee of 1 per cent of Adjusted Grass Revenue (AGR) excluding 15e 5 per cent USO charge; and
 - (f) if so, details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRI GURUDAS KAMAT): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Certain phone firms have been charged with misreporting their revenue. Hence, DoT has decided to conduct Special Audit of Bharti Airtel, Reliance Communications, Vodafone Essar Ltd., Idea Cellular Ltd. and Tata Teleservices Ltd.

- (c) and (d) Collection of Telecom License fee in first two quarter of fiscal 2008-09 is Rs. 4736.46 crores and collection in previous fiscal year 2007-08 is Rs. 8826.45 crores.
- (e) and (f) Yes, Sir. The COAI *vide* letter dated 29.04.2009 has submitted that the revenue share license fee should be prescribed at a uniform rate of 1% of AGR and the same should not include the USO levy. The aspect of USO levy should be dealt with separately. Further, it is requested to the Government to implement the uniform license fee structure for the telecom sector.

Landline subscription of Delhi and Mumbai

- 1354. SHRIMATI HEMA MALINI: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that landline subscribers of Delhi and Mumbai can talk in between without any STD charges; and
- (b) if so, what is preventing Government to extend such facilities to other metropolitan cities like Chennai and Kolkata?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRI GURUDAS KAMAT): (a) Yes, Sir. Landline subscribers of MTNL in Delhi and Mumbai can talk to each other without any STD charges.

(b) As per the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) Act of 1997, the power to regulate tariff of telecom services in the country is vested with TRAI. TRAI, in exercise of its powers, has put most of the tariffs (except Rural, National Roaming and leased circuits) under forbearance. This implies that all service providers, including BSNL and MTNL, are at liberty to offer tariffs according to needs of subscribers and market conditions. Till now, BSNL has not found extension of such facility to other metropolitan cites like Chennai and Kolkata financially viable.

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that every two minutes a plane flies over 13th century Qutub Minar and Archaeological survey of India (ASI) officials expressed concern over frequent flights over it;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether vibrations from aircrafts could affect foundation of the monument, one of the tallest in the world, located in a seismic zone;
 - (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether ASI has written to Ministry of Civil Aviation asking to ensure that low flying planes do not come close to the monument; and
 - (f) if so, the details thereof and reaction of Ministry of Civil Aviation thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI V. NARAYANASAMY): (a) to (f) Yes, Sir. A number of flights pass over the Qutub Minar. The Director General, Archaeological Survey of India has requested Director General, Civil Aviation (DGCA) to look into the matter and take up Environment
