

Education reform

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the sweeping education reforms undertaken by Government recently have been given well response as well as criticism;
- (b) if so, the facts and details thereof;
- (c) whether there is abnormal delay in the implementation of the new education reform agenda in the country and the sufferers are students; and
- (d) if so, the further steps Government proposes to take to implement the new education reforms in an effective way?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI) : (a) and (b) The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) in consultation with the Ministry of Human Resource Development and keeping in view of the spirit of National Policy of Education, 1986 has decided to introduce following educational reforms :-

- i) There will be no class X Board examination *w.e.f.* 2011 for students studying in CBSE's Senior Secondary Schools and who do not wish to move out of the CBSE system after Class -X. The students studying in CBSE's Secondary Schools will, however, be required to appear in Board's external examination because they will be leaving the Secondary School after Class X.
- ii) The Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation has been strengthened in all CBSE affiliated schools *w.e.f.* October, 2009 in Class IX.
- iii) The new Grading System has been introduced at Secondary School Level (for Class IX and X) effective from 2009-10 academic session. During various meetings with stakeholders, survey etc. the Board has received overwhelming response.

Further, the Right of Children to Free & Compulsory Education Act 2009 has been enacted which envisages significant reforms in the Elementary Education sector specially with reference to admission, attendance and completion of elementary education by all children in schools which conform to specified norms and standards.

Appropriate policy reforms in higher education sector have also been undertaken. Section 6 of the Central Universities Act, 2009 provides for academic reforms in newly established Central Universities. The reforms are being extended to other Central Educational Institutions also. The reforms have generally been well received.

Secondary education in the country

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that secondary education system in the country is estimated to be less than country's requirement;
- (b) if so, the shortfall as per Government estimate;
- (c) the ratio between the number of boys aged between 14 and 18 and a secondary school in country's rural and urban areas at present;
- (d) whether Government has formulated targeted time bound plan for the development of this system; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) and (b) As per Selected Educational Statistics- 2006-07, the enrolment for classes IX-X was 2.59 crore as against the estimated population of 4.86 crore in the corresponding age group 14-15. The enrolment for classes IX- XII was 3.99 crore as against the estimated population of 9.71 crore in the age group 14-17.

(c) As per Selected Educational Statistics 2006-07, the projected population of boys in the age group 14 -17 was 5.10 crore and the total number of secondary and senior secondary schools was 1.69 lakh. Separate information for rural and urban areas is not available in the Selected Educational Statistics, 2006-07.
